CITY OF AMES, TEXAS RESOLUTION NO. 2025-007

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AMES, TEXAS, DECLARING CERTAIN PROPERTY AS SURPLUS AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, OR DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE SALE OF DISPOSAL OF SAID PROPERTY.

WHEREAS, the City of Ames, Texas, ("City") is the owner of certain items of personal property more particularly described herein; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the aforesaid personal property is not needed or required for the City's foreseeable needs but still has some usefulness for the purpose it was originally intended and may or may not have value and therefore determined as surplus property; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to dispose of the surplus property identified herein and authorize the mayor or designee to sell or dispose of said property.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF AMES, TEXAS:

SECTION 1 - FINDINGS

The City Council finds the statements made in the preamble above are true and correct.

SECTION 2 – DECLARATION OF SURPLUS PROPERTY

The City declares the personal property described as a motor vehicle, 2008 F-150 4x2 White Regular Cab (VIN: 1FTPF12538KD25432), used primarily by Public Works is not needed or required for the City's foreseeable needs but finds it still has some usefulness for the purpose it was originally intended and may or may not have value and therefore declared as surplus property of the City.

SECTION 3 – AUTHORIZATION OF SALE OR DISPOSAL

The mayor, or designee, is hereby authorized to sell or dispose of said personal property through an auction of said property described in Section 2; if the City receives no bids the mayor, or designee, is authorized to sell or dispose of said personal property in any other manner in compliance with State law. The sale of the surplus property is to be made "as is" and without any warranties.

SECTION 4 – SEVERABILITY

If any section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, or word of this Resolution or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution, and the City Council hereby

declares that it would have passed such portions remaining despite invalidity or unconstitutionality.

SECTION 5 – EFFECTIVE DATE

This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon it passage.
